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Paul and Barnabas Acts 13:4 through Acts 14:26



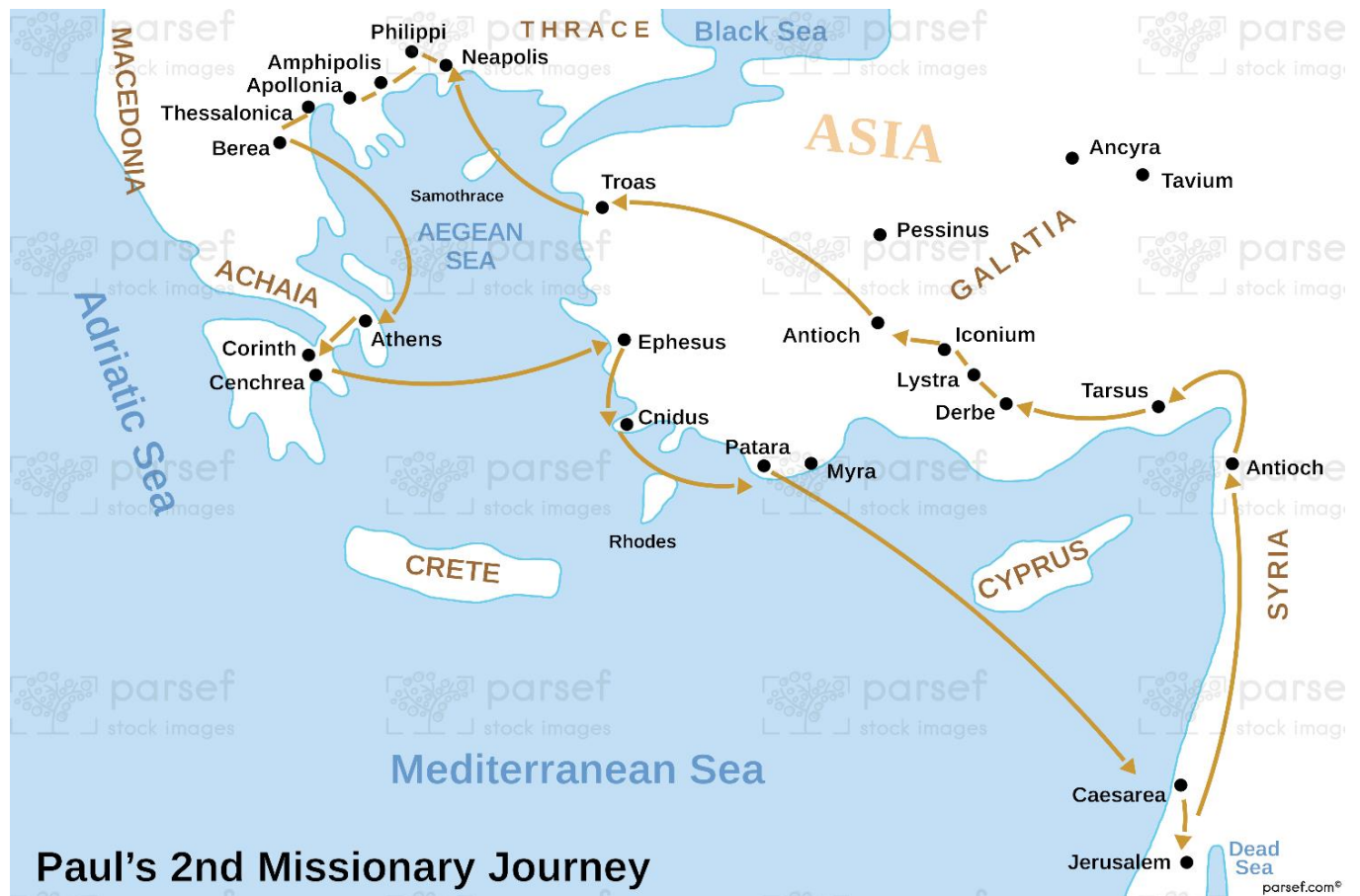
Acts 13:9 (KJV) Then Saul, (who also *is called* Paul,) filled with the Holy Ghost, set his eyes on him,

Acts 13:13 (KJV) Now when Paul and his company loosed from Paphos, they came to Perga in Pamphylia: and **John departing** from them returned to Jerusalem.

Acts 18:19-20 (KJV) And there came thither *certain* Jews from Antioch and Iconium, who persuaded the people, and, **having stoned Paul**, drew *him* out of the city, supposing he had been dead.

²⁰ Howbeit, as the disciples stood round about him, he rose up, and came into the city: and the next day he departed with Barnabas to Derbe.

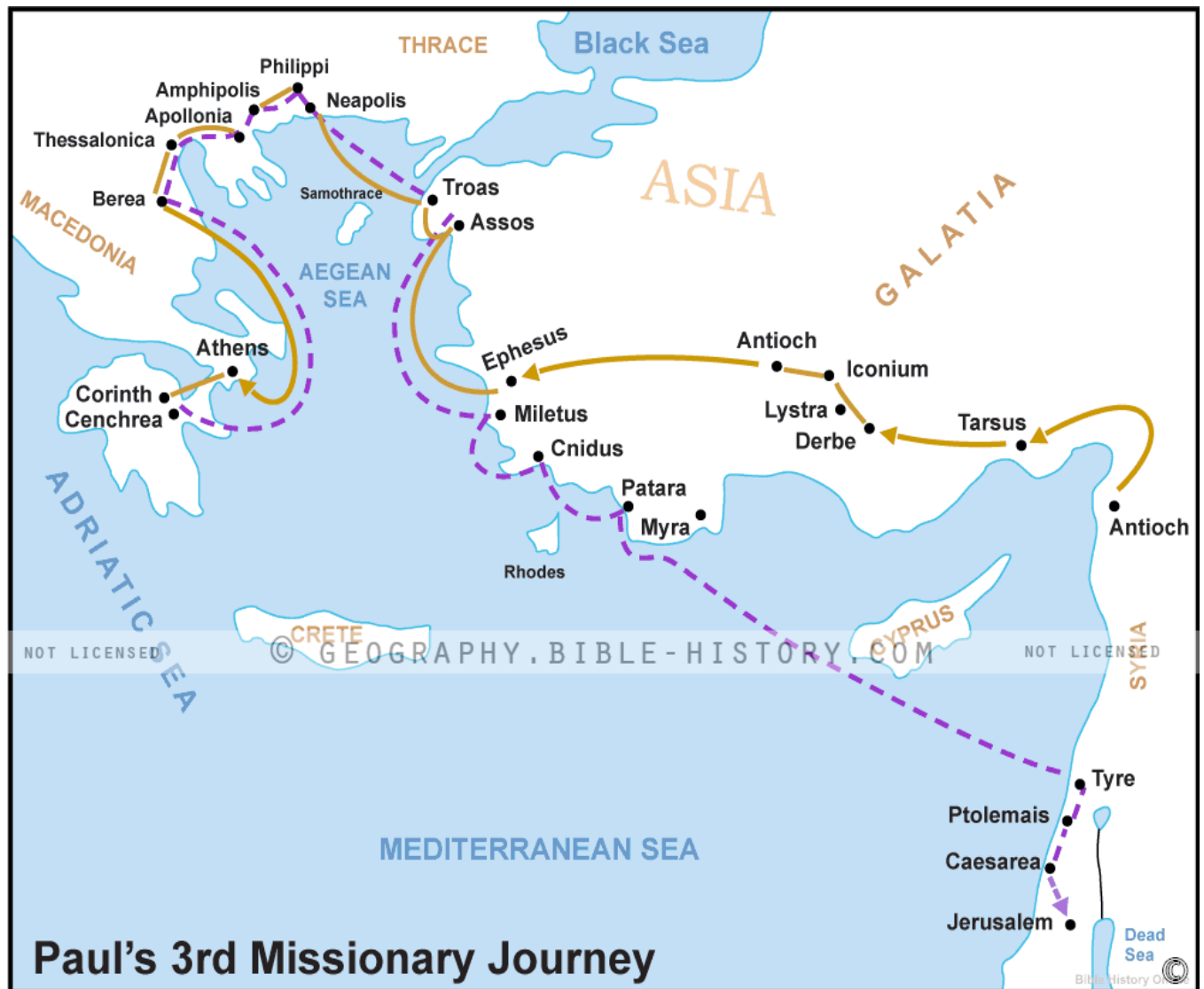

Acts 16:23 (KJV) And when they had laid many **stripes** upon them, they cast *them* into **prison**, charging the jailor to keep them safely:

Acts 18:1-3 (KJV) ¹ After these things Paul departed from Athens, and came to Corinth; ² And found a certain Jew named **Aquila**, born in Pontus, lately come from Italy, with his wife **Priscilla**; (because that Claudius had commanded all Jews to depart from Rome:) and came unto them. ³ And because he was of the same craft, he abode with them, and wrought: for by their occupation they were **tentmakers**.

Paul and Others Acts 18:23 through Acts 21:17



Acts 18:26 (KJV) And he began to speak boldly in the synagogue: whom when **Aquila** and **Priscilla** had heard, they took him unto *them*, and expounded unto him the way of God more perfectly.

Acts 20:4 (KJV) And there accompanied him into Asia **Sopater** of Berea; and of the Thessalonians, **Aristarchus** and **Secundus**; and **Gaius** of Derbe, and **Timotheus**; and of Asia, **Tychicus** and **Trophimus**.

Acts 20:16 (KJV) For Paul had determined to sail by Ephesus, because he would not spend the time in Asia: for he hasted, if it were possible for him, to be at Jerusalem the day of Pentecost.
